KILLING THE WEEDS

The older I get, the warmer I like the weather to be. Don't get me wrong, glistening snow is beautiful from the protective window pane of my wellinsulated house; but when I stép out-

Longer days, warmer temperatures and bright sunshine are good for my soul... reminders that summer is coming! I also love the new life that Spring brings. Each year, I plot how to make the most of my small ders the darkness space and choose to plant produce (most of) our family would enjoy eating. However, there is one variety of growth—one type of new life that I do not like. I absolutely detest

weeds. The dark earth of a freshly plowed garden is ripe with expectation until those unwanted invaders rear their ugly heads. I think there will be growth in heaven, but I do not think there will be weeds.

Recently, I was reflecting on new spiritual life. I have been so blessed to experience several dear ones surrender their hearts and lives to Jesus. Watching them grow and blossom is even more thrilling than watching Spring unfold on the Palouse. The wonder and joy of new life in Christ is like no other. Though no two people are exactly alike, new Christians often go through some similar experiences. When a new believer learns and begins to understand the realities of what Jesus did for them on the cross, it does several things. Often, they feel humbled by Jesus' sacrifice. They experience joy for their newfound salvation, gratitude for a free gift they do not deserve and they are compelled to share the Good News with others. As I was thinking about these realities and emotions new believers experience, I was reminded too of the common weeds that threaten to attack new believers.

Satan, the Devil, the Evil One is the sower of weeds. Weeds are the lies he tells us to try to stunt our growth, to choke out blossoming new life. Nothing angers him more than a new Christian, growing and thriving in Christ. He attempts to choke out such growth by perpetrating lies.

Common weeds include guilt, doubt and fear. When we realize the price Christ paid for our sins we realize just how ugly our sin is, which can lead to guilt and even shame. While it is good and healthy to feel convicted of our sin, it is a tactic of the evil one to burden us down with guilt. Guilt cripples us from fulfilling God's purpose for our life. Doubt often creeps in when our non-Christian friends and family complain about our new Christian lifestyle. Understandably, they feel confused and betrayed when we have a new love and passion in our life that they don't share. Sometimes they will act out by questioning our devotion and conviction—by planting the seeds of doubt. Satan specializes in fear. He tells us we aren't worthy of God's love, aren't capable of living the Christian lifestyle—can't handle the pressures of living for Jesus in this world. He reminds us of our past sins, tempts us to define ourselves by our old behaviors. He tells us we are failures - unlovable and unchangeable.

There is a way to render these weeds powerless—to really kill them. We learn about weed killer from Jesus. The cure for Satan's lies is truth. To really "round-up" and rid ourselves of his weeds we must ex-

Whether you are a new Christian, just beginning to bud and grow for the first time, or you have been a mature Christian for years, we all struggle with weeds. If we long to have true and lasting weed control

in our lives, we must immerse ourselves in the truth. Remember the truth of the gospel—Jesus died to save us from all of our sins - past present and future. Do not let guilt, doubt and fear stunt your growth. Let the truth of scripture overwhelm you. Hide it in your heart and keep it with you.

Weeds may continue to poke through the surface of your heart, but you do not have to let them grow.

The light of truth always renders the darkness powerless. Jesus sums it up in Matthew 4:4, "Jesus answered, 'It is written: Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God."




OIKOS - WHAT IS IT?


