A STORY WORTH TELLING



We love a well-told story; and we imagine, like us, most people enjoy the art of story-telling - whether as the teller or the listener. There's just something about stories that captivate our hearts and minds. Storytelling helps us effectively communicate ideas and emotions. Simply put, a well-told story has the power to make an impact. Jesus himself



impact. Jesus himself employed the art of storytelling to communicate important truths to first-century Jews and Gentiles.

If we really think about it, stories are a part of our lives every day. There are, however, some stories we don't tell often enough - stories so powerful and close to us that perhaps we feel awkward sharing them. Inside of a faith community, these types of stories have another name - "testimonies." A testimony isn't unique to Christianity, we see them all the time

fully in their life. Kevin Harney, pastor and author of *Organic Outreach for Individuals*, says: "Followers of Jesus don't have one testimony; we have many. Because God is active and working in our lives, we have new stories to tell every day. These stories, or testimonies, recount how God is present and powerful."

Your testimony might be the story of an answered prayer, physical healing, restoration of shattered hearts, the rebuilding of a broken marriage, newfound freedom

See STORY Page 2 from fear and worry, release from addiction, forgiveness of sin, comfort of the lonely, receiving new purpose or direction, attaining financial peace - the list goes on and on.

These testimony stories are worth telling! They share the truth of a loving God that cares deeply about humanity - about you and your neighbor.

This month, we want to encourage you to share one of your testimonies (faith stories) with someone who hasn't heard it before. Consider telling one of your stories to someone on your Oikos list that you've been praying for or, perhaps, ask

á trusted friend tó help you practice. Either way - your stories need to be told because they need to be heard!

If you're still nervous about sharing, consider that telling your testimony can encourage other believers. Not only that, Jesus can use your story to meet people right where they are! Praying for your Oikos is important, but sharing your testimony with those same people can make a big difference too. Kevin Harney writes, "A

testimony is not so much about us as it is about the presence and power of the God who is alive in us.

- Pray, that God will begin to show you opportunities to naturally share, and
- Pray, that He will bring to mind the right testimony story for the moment, and that you will act with boldness when you sense it's time to share.

I was honored this year to serve at two summer camps - Junior Camp, which serves 4^{th} - 6^{th} graders and High School Camp.

At Junior Camp, I spent the week with a cabin full of energetic youngsters. Honestly, being a cabin counselor is a lot of hard work - it's a 24-hour-a-day job for the time you are



there. But, as difficult as it is, it also is very rewarding. It is truly a deep blessing to pray with the kids and study God's Word with them - seeing them open their heart to the Lord.

SHAKING THE ROCKS OUT

Recently, as I prepared to go on my morning run, I slipped on my running shoes and laced them up. Unfortunately, it became clear after only a couple of steps that I had a problem. It felt like I had a huge



rock in the heal of one of my shoes. I stopped where I was and quickly took the shoe off and shook it. Out came a tiny little pebble which had been responsible for my discomfort. That pebble reminded me of a, now famous, family story:

My dad and brothers had spent the day working out in the field with my Uncle Robert. My uncle was a hard working and weathered man who had no time to take breaks or take it easy. After several hours of labor in the field, my uncle turned to my dad and brothers to apologize, "I am sorry, I

hate to do it, but I'm going to have to stop for a minute. There's a rock in my shoe and it's driving me crazy." As he took off the boot and shook it---out fell a fork! No kidding! It was an actual fork! He had been working all morning with a fork in his boot! Now, how tough does your foot have to be to not notice a fork in your boot!?!

As I got back to my run, with the story of Uncle Robert fresh in my mind, I began thinking about how sin is like a rock in

your shoe. When we first become convicted of our sins and realize that we are in need of forgiveness, we go to Jesus who paid the price for our forgiveness on the cross. 1 John 1:9 tells us:

"If we confess our sins He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteous-

Once Jesus has wiped our slate clean, we must strive to keep our slate clean. Christians aren't perfect and often we will find ourselves in need of forgiveness once again. When we commit a sin - do something we know is wrong - the Holy Spirit, living inside of us, makes us feel uncomfortable - like that pebble in my shoe.

I don't like feeling that way - it makes walking through my day difficult and painful. I have to stop and get rid of it, which I do by asking God for forgiveness and seeking to turn away from the sin (this is called repenting) to keep from repeating the sin again. This is the rhythm of life when we keep short accounts. We take care of sin quickly when the Holy Spirit points it out to us and we actively attempt to turn from it and stay away from it.



love of Christ real for individuals and communities around the world who suffer the effects of disaster, conflict, or **5 H A R I N G** severe economic hardship.

Thank you for your generous support - More than \$900 was given this year by folks at PFC.

Unfortunately, we don't always keep short accounts, do we? It is possible to ignore the conviction of the Holy Spirit and this is what we sometimes do. We commit a sin and the Holy Spirit, lovingly and clearly points out our wrong, but instead of confessing and repenting we make excuses, we justify our behavior, pretending not to hear Him or just blatantly ig-noring Him. When we do this consistently, over time our hearts become calloused. Much like my uncle's feet had slowly become hardened by ignoring pain over time, we get so used to living with the uncomfortable tension that we learn how

to turn that part of us off. Before we know it, we have ignored the conviction of sin so long that the sin has grown unchecked. The white lie that once sent us asking for forgiveness has become a pattern of lies and dishonesty. The idle word spoken about a neighbor has become a pattern of gossip. The lustful glance left unchecked has become an adulteress affair. It is no longer a pebble in our shoe. We now are running around with a fork in our boot.

I haven't researched this officially, but I can almost guarantee that living with a fork in your boot causes all kinds of damage. Sin does the same thing, it cripples us, and yet we refuse to get rid of it.

It happens people. It happens often. Faithful, Jesus-loving believers wake up in a state of sin that they never imagined they were capable of. Almost always, these situations are a product of a "small" sin left unchecked. We brush off the conviction of the Holy Spirit only to find ourselves capable of things we would never have imagined. What makes this extra scary is that it could happen to any of us. So often I remember the wisdom, "there but by the grace of God go

Proverbs 4:23 tells us:

"Therefore, guard your heart (or "keep it with all vigilance," ESV) for from it flow the springs of life."

What does guarding your heart look like? Well I talked about that in my July article and there is so much more to say, but I think it all boils down to this: heed the guidance of the Holy Spirit in your life. First, get familiar with the Holy Spirit through reading scripture and by spending time in quiet reflection - listening. Second, do not ignore Him! When he guides you to do something—get busy. When you feel that uneasy feeling, that conviction of sin, confess and repent quickly.

Many of us in God's church are running around with rocks in our shoes. Let us take the time, humble ourselves and shake the rocks out before we become calloused and find our-selves in the middle of a field with a fork in our boot.

Already have a list—maybe you need to revisit it and add or remove people who have moved in and out of your sphere of influence.

And remember—pray for them daily.
