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## ENEMIES OF THE HEART BOOK REVIEW

Some books are “easy” reads - not only is the author readable and understandable, but the content is expected and inoffensive. In other words, you already agree with what the author is saying and reading the book served to strengthen your resolve and build you up. Then, there are books that shake you to the core - they challenge your beliefs and ideas. These books may force you to come face to face with truths you would rather ignore. Although the author may be likable and understandable, these books are not “easy” to read. Recently I read a terribly difficult and incredibly good book called *Enemies of the Heart* by Andy Stanley.

Stanley identifies four emotions that have the tendency to “control” you. These emotions are “Enemies of the Heart.” I know, from my own experience that Andy Stanley is right, as I have experienced these four emotions as they controlled me: guilt, anger, jealousy and greed. I know that they can, and do, have the power to control. I really wanted to argue with Stanley as he dives into the root causes of these painful habits. But I believe he is right—he nailed it. Guilt, he believes, is a result of “I owe you” thinking. I have done some type of wrong and am always living in a shadow of “owing” someone. Anger comes from “You owe me” thinking.

more than I have, therefore I owe it to myself to get more. Jealousy is a result of “God owes me” thinking. How dare God give something to someone else that I want or deserve. God has wronged me and now He owes me.

The really wonderful news about this book is that Stanley doesn’t just give us the reasons for these dangerous habits and then end the book. I have long believed that we cannot just simply “stop” a

harmful habit - it is much more practical to **replace** a bad habit with a healthy one - and Stanley believes the same thing. For each of the four “enemy” habits he has laid out healthy habits that remedy them.

The remedy for guilt is confession. Confession is a step toward change. It precedes physical and spiritual restoration. In scripture, confession always is associated with change. Confession is just one step in a sequence that leads the guilty out of the dark and into the light. Keeping short accounts with others and being in the habit of confessing our wrongs instead of hiding or attempting to justify them will remedy guilt.

The remedy for anger is forgiveness. Anger happens when what we want or need is taken from us. Anger gains its strength from secrecy. We don’t always talk about the wrong but on the inside we cannot help but dwell on it. Through forgiveness we expose our pain without denying its truth and we choose to no longer allow it to hold power over us. In other words, we don’t pretend that the wrong never happened, but we **choose** to no longer be bitter.

Stanley believes that fear lies at the heart of greed. When you peel back all the layers of wanting “more” you realize there is fear that God cannot be trusted to take care of you and therefore you must pile up “things” to take care of yourself. The remedy to greed then, is generosity. Every time we give generously we are subtly reminding our inner worrier that God cares for His kids and that He is able and willing to provide for us.

Jealousy is evident in all human relationships. Almost all problems and strife boil down to the fact that one person has something the other one wants. We see it in the Bible and we see it presently in our own lives. Stanley believes the habit that can keep jealousy at bay is celebration. We need to become people who celebrate the successes of others. Congratulate, compliment and praise the success and achievements of others. It will become much more difficult to resent them or become jealous if we are the ones publicly singing their praises.

Practicing healthy habits is a beautiful way to keep the ugly habits, that are terminal to our hearts, at bay. This book is difficult to read because of its truth, but it also is incredibly encouraging because it provides practical solutions. Don't just take my word for it - you need to read this book for yourself.

*Enemies of the Heart* will mess with you. But I believe we all need to be “messed with.” God loves us too much to leave us the same. If He is nudging you to begin dealing with one of the negative habits that is crippling you—this book will help.

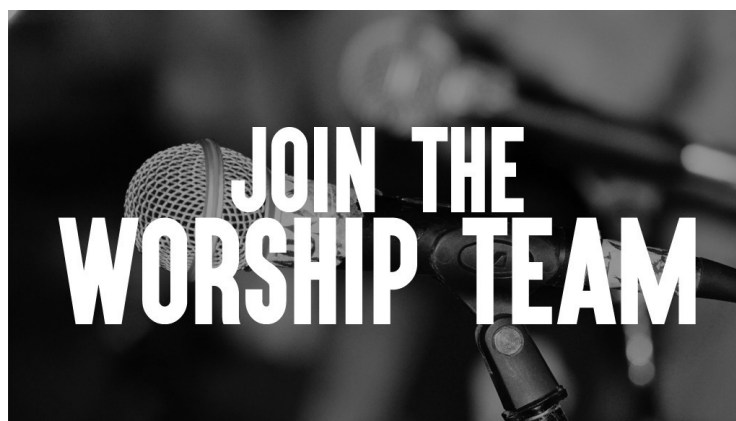

On the first Wednesday of every month we meet around the table in the Fellowship Hall. Our next session is June 7th at 6:30 PM.

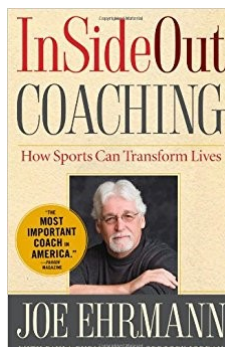

The first three Sundays in June we will have a sermon series from the book of Acts called: "The Church." In itself "The Church" is a pretty generic title, especially when you consider that church in its simple definition means "gathered people." Here are the three sermon "sub titles" for the series:



1. Open Arms
2. Keeps Growing
3. Persecuted and Protected

In a nutshell these titles describe quite a bit about God's plan through His people, the Church.

1. We are to be a people of open arms, inviting all to come into a relationship with Jesus Christ. (Read Acts 11:17)

3. The Church will always be persecuted on earth and yet it will be protected from heaven. (Read Acts 12:2-3,7,11,24)

We are the people who must love the world knowing we will be persecuted sometimes by some people, but we will always be overseen and protected by the One True God.

# DIVING IN

Kevin Harney, the author of several books on outreach recently provided to many leaders in our church, has compelled me to dive in and share my faith more and more. In his series of books, Harney discusses "preparing the soil" - every good gardener wants to do that! Using the Law of Love, he points out that outreach is about having a heart deeply in love with God and with people. As we love others, form relationships and connect with others around us, we need to dive in and make the effort to intentionally share our faith stories. When we do so, we are preparing the soil for seeds of faith to grow.

Harney also discusses God's reckless and extravagant grace. He asks the reader to:

"Think of one extravagant and undeserved act of loving grace you can offer to a person in your life who is not a follower of Jesus. Prayerfully offer it with no strings attached. If they ask you why you did what you did, tell them about the grace you have received and how it compels you to extend the love of God to others."

What a challenge!

More and more I'm praying for God's grace to be revealed through me. Ephesians 2:4-9 tells us that by grace we have been saved. It's a gift of God. He wants to show us the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. And so, every day, I pray for his grace to flow through me. "Fill me with so much grace that it cascades from me to everyone I meet each day."

It's time to dive in. And watch that prepared soil get some new seeds of faith growing in our community. It's a challenge we all can share. Jesus himself urges us to "be the salt" and "shine the light" to those around us who are disconnected spiritually.

When you hear the word “**change**,” what do you think of first? On the Palouse, it usually refers to the weather as in, “If you don't like the weather just wait a few minutes and it will **change**.”

For the purpose of this article, I would like you to think of **change** as an alteration or modification. Our church has recently received some financial gifts from various members of our congregation which have allowed us to make some alterations and modifications to our existing kitchen. Depending on how much time you spend in our kitchen, you may or may not have noticed some of the following:

- ♦ 2 new dishwashers (to start the dishwashing cycle, push the start button twice).
- ♦ New faucets with spray attachments on each of the double sinks and the utility sink.
- ♦ New cupboards on the back wall of the kitchen - allowing us to have a bit more room to store items.
- ♦ A new overhead fan that will hopefully make cleanup after big events more comfortable temperature wise for the volunteers.

During the next few weeks, these alterations will be listed on an orange piece of paper that is attached to the refrigerator. At the conclusion of the modifications there will be new larger signage that will better identify item locations. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated!

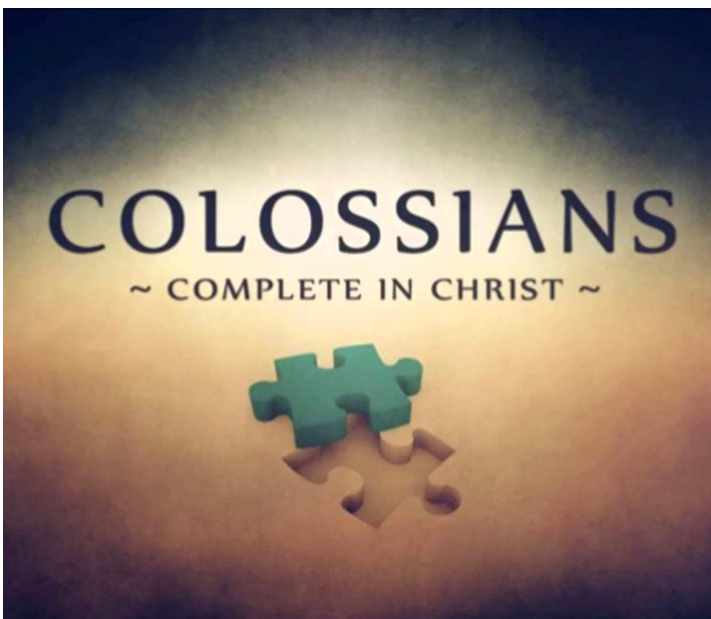
