What can you do in nine months? Well, you could finish a grade in school, complete two semesters of college, maybe have a baby...or...start a university.



Starting a university was not on my top -10 to-do list, but on November 8, 2017, my employer, Moody Bible Institute, announced their decision to close the Spokane campus at the end of June. Within a week, a group of Spokane Moody faculty began talking about the possibility of starting our own university. As we talked, prayed, and prayed some more, we became convinced that God wasn't finished with biblical higher education in Spokane at our location on East Indiana with its 45-year history in various incarnations. It seemed to us that God started this **AND** He was not done.

With no experience starting a university, the learning curve not only had curves, but mountains, and what felt like deserts at times. We began the gargantuan task, divided up projects, and set out, one step at a time, encouraging one another, and learning a new dimension of trusting God. We began an arduous state-approval process that, *finally*, after nine-and-a-half months, ended with the joyous news on August 20, 2018, that we were **INDEED** state-approved and able to officially open our doors and begin enrolling students (imagine a celebratory sound track here!). The sign

guys had a picture-happy audience while they installed the sign; we were out there from the time they rolled up with their lift until we could take a group photo.

Some facts you might not know: Our full-time faculty, and founding members, all have a Ph.D. and years of ministry experience. Together we dreamed big! GNU offers seven Bachelor of Arts majors including Biblical and Theological Studies, Communication, Leadership Studies, Youth and Family Ministry, Intercultural Studies, Linguistics, and TESOL (Teaching English as a Second Language). In addition, we also offer seven one-year certificates in Bible, TESOL, Applied Linguistics, Youth and Family Ministry, and three Area Studies certificates—East Asia, Eastern Europe, and Western Europe. Auditing classes also is a possibility. Continuing the tradition of Christian service, our students will engage the community through required weekly field experience.

OFF THE SHELF

A REVIEW OF: DIDN'T SEE IT COMING

AUTHOR: CAREY NEIUWHOF



I think Carey Nieuwhof may be spying on me. For those of you who aren't familiar with Nieuwhof, he is the founding pastor of Connexus Church in Barrie, Ontario. It is one of the fastest growing, most influential churches in North America. He has written several books on leadership and produces the *Carey Nieuwhof Leadership Podcast*, which draws millions of listeners every week. I am one of those listeners who every week tunes in to the podcast listening to Nieuwhof humbly and thoughtfully interview an influential and successful pastor, thinker or business professional on the subject of leadership. I first learned of Nieuwhof when Pastor Corey recommended I read one of his books a couple of years ago. So, you can imagine my excitement when I heard about the opportunity to be involved in the "Launch Team" for his newest book, *Didn't See It Coming* which will be released September 4, 2018. I jumped at the chance and was given an advance copy of the book, which I just finished reading.

So why do I think Carey Nieuwhof has been spying on me? Page by page as I have worked my way through this new book, I've read about myself. As Nieuwhof reveals "The 7 Greatest Challenges That No One Expects and Everyone Experiences," I quickly realized I absolutely am one of the "Everyone" identified in the subtitle. When I was young, energetic and idealistic, I never imagined myself becoming a 40-something who struggled with cynicism, compromise, disconnection, irrelevance, pride, burnout or emptiness. Yet, Nieuwhof claims these seven challenges seem to sneak up on most of us. Reading through each chapter, I saw myself in so many of the stories and examples he shared.

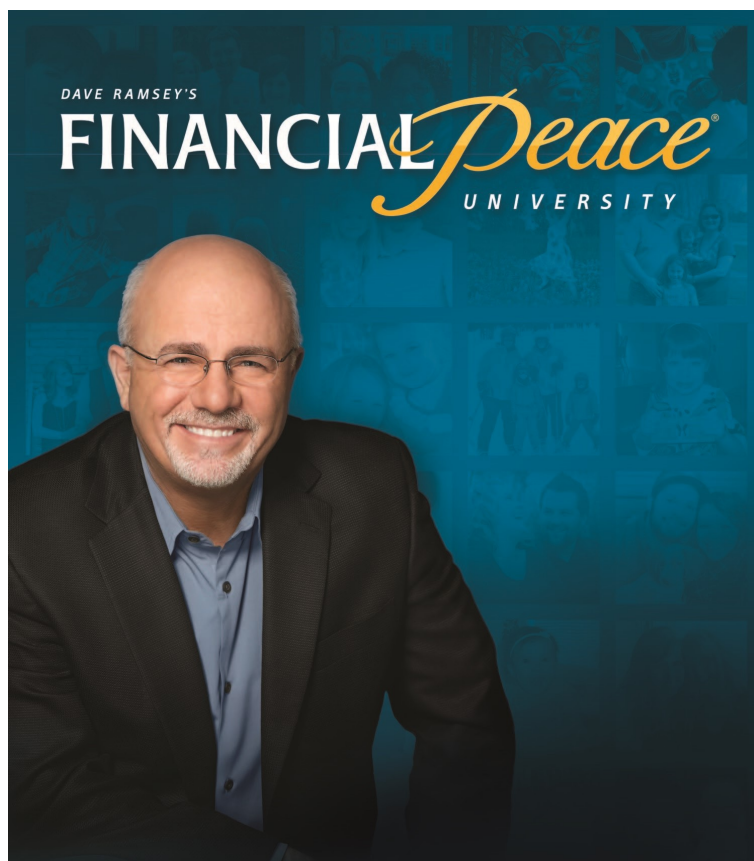
Luckily for readers, there is good news. With each the challenges identified by Nieuwhof, he also offers a "cure" which is both refreshing and empowering. What a relief to know that we are not powerless or destined to surrender to these challenges.

I believe this book could be helpful for many of us. One of my theology professors, Dr. Christopher Hall, taught me that, "the greatest barrier to spiritual growth is self-deception." His words always have stuck with me - ringing so true. Most of us don't knowingly ignore the signs that we are heading in the wrong direction with our spiritual health, we are just completely unaware. Books like *Didn't See It Coming* encourage us to stop and reflect, to examine our spiritual health and make needed adjustments - self-reflection is necessary and beneficial, whether you are 12 years old or 90 years old. None of us are immune to self-deception.

I was blessed to be one of the first to get to read *Didn't See It Coming: Overcoming the 7 Greatest Challenges That No One Expects and Everyone Experiences* and though it was challenging, I feel so blessed and encouraged. I invite you to pick up a copy or look for it in the church library. You will be glad you did!

Another year of Vacation Bible School (VBS) is in the books! The VBS theme, Shipwrecked, inspired some creative decorating from the men in the Way Too Early Bible Study who volunteered to create a life-sized wrecked ship on the stage. What an amazing feat that was!



As kids arrived for VBS on Monday morning, they were transported to a desert island to learn more about Jesus. Kids learned from characters like Hope the Cheetah, Beacon the Toucan, Ray the Stingray, Guac the Iguana, and Moe the Sloth. Throughout the day, they explored the various stations, including Bible Stories, Missions, Imagination Station, and Games, and learned that no matter what situation you are in, *Jesus Rescues!* Whether you are lonely, worrying about something, struggling with a problem, doing wrong, or feeling powerless, Jesus will ALWAYS be there to rescue you.



A favorite part of each day was watching the 93 kids and teens worshipping God during the Castaway Sing and Play and Sail Away Sendoff. Weeks later, many of us still are singing *Never Let Go of Me* and *Won't Worry 'Bout a Thing*.

VBS touched many kids' hearts, not just here in Palouse, but in Uganda too, as kids raised money for school fees for the Hope 4 All Children orphanage. Between the kids' donations and the gifts of our Palouse Federated Church family, more than \$2,000 was raised - enough to send all school-aged kids at the orphanage to school for two of the three terms! WOW!

VBS doesn't happen without a lot of help and we couldn't have done it without the many volunteers and donors who gave supplies or their time. A very special thank you to all of you who prayed for our team and the kids! Working together we are pointing kids toward Jesus and watching Him change their hearts!
