

JONAH OR JESUS?

Pastor Corey Laughary

I am deeply encouraged by our journey through the little book of Jonah. This book tells a GREAT story of God's GREAT mercy for people who are running from Him.

God has used this book to challenge me. How am I running from God's

call to love others? Am I running like Jonah, away from a call to radical mission towards others? Have I shaped God into someone who always agrees with my likes and dislikes? Have I remade God into someone who always affirms my personal political and ethical convictions?

Jonah did. God busted up Jonah's false ideas. God loves us when we disagree with Him, but God loves us enough to deepen and broaden our view of Him. God made sure Jonah knew that God loved Nineveh and wanted to see them turn from their evil ways. God made His love for broken people abundantly clear by using Jonah not only to reach Nineveh, but also to reach the sailors that were aboard the ship taking him to Tarshish. Jonah ran from

I was so obsessed with what was going on inside the whale that I missed seeing the drama inside Jonah.

God's call on his life to reach out to "heathen" sinners, and God taught Jonah of His love by using him twice in a very short span of time to do His will to reach His "heathen" children.

God loves people outside the Church as much as He loves those inside the Church. God is asking His people to reach out to those who need to hear God's call of love, forgiveness and relationship.

Sometimes people in the Church can be lost, just like Jonah was lost. God loves us and wants our hearts to be like His. Jesus told a story about two brothers - you can read it in Luke 15. The older brother in the story was not glad when his little brother returned home after a selfish and sinful journey. The older brother is like Christian religious people who are not excited about welcoming in people who are far from God; he is like Jonah who doesn't want the people of Nineveh to have a second chance. God wants us to learn from the example of Jonah and choose instead the way of Jesus - to love the outsider, the broken, and those who appear far from God.

If it were not for Jesus and His love for me, I would not be here. I would not know God, and I would not be serving Him. I would not be seeking to bless people on the Palouse. But God loved me and, through Jesus, rescued me from a life of selfish living and called me to do His will. His way is much better than my way.

I want to have the Jonah in me changed into the likeness of Jesus. How about you?



MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY

Pastor Corey Laughary

I feel God has been leading me in a journey towards a Mental Health Ministry for a long time. Before going to seminary and becoming a pastor I worked for two years on a Mental Health/Suicide Prevention hotline called "First Call for Help" run by Spokane Mental Health. I then worked at a group home for troubled youth



that had many residents who lived with mental illness. At the time, I considered going to graduate school for a Master's in Social Work or counseling. God clearly called me on a path toward being a pastor, but I have never forgotten those experiences and lessons learned on the hotline and at the group home. Talking daily with people who are depressed and struggling to find hope in life doesn't leave your soul easily.

Since December, I have felt a strong calling to involve mental health ministry in my calling here on the Palouse as pastor and in our ministry at PFC. The brief list below includes some of the areas I am called to, and also that we are getting involved in as a church. If you have questions, concerns, or want to receive help, or perhaps join in on this journey - PLEASE contact me.

FAQDDDD | A group meeting at PFC once or twice a month that learns about mental

related issues. It is a safe place and time to ask questions and talk about important issues that we sometimes struggle to talk about. So far, we have discussed depression, anxiety, suicide and suicide intervention. FAQDDDD stands for: Féar, Anxiety, Questions, Doubts, Despair, Depression and Discouragement. If you are interested in learning more contact me.

Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is a national program, and in early April I am becoming a certified MHFA trainer. This will allow our church to bring trainings to the Palouse. Because of generous donations I am able to attend this course and provide initial trainings at no cost or low cost to students. The MHFA trainings here in the Palouse will include 8 hours of content and certify people as Mental Health First Aid Responders. Keep your ears open for our first classes- hopefully sometime in April.

Chaplaincy | I will continue to serve as a volunteer chaplain to our local Police, Fire and EMS. I have received training for helping individuals in crisis and will be receiving group crisis intervention training in mid-April. This course also was provided for by individual donations. At PFC we feel called to serve people affected by crisis - individuals, families, and first responders and we will continue to be a resource for our local schools as needed.

Companionship | I have a vision for how together, we can begin helping people become companions and better friends to those who struggle with an ongoing mental health issue. This ministry is not yet developed, but I would gladly begin coaching any individual who feels called to be a helping companion to someone who lives with a mental illness.

Counseling | We are developing better relationships with Christian Counselors in our area and will refer people in need to trained counselors when appropriate. One such counselor is Laura Rehwaldt, (MA) who is willing to meet with people in Palouse or at her office in Pullman and offers rates on a sliding scale depending on income.



Rarely do I start and finish reading a book in one weekend. Rarely - as in never. Never had I read an entire book in two days until I picked up the book, It's Not Supposed to be This Way by Lysa Terkeurst.


"This is a book about expectations, disappointments and God's goodness to us in the midst of incredible suffering."

Lysa is the founder of Proverbs 31 Ministries and has written devotionals and encouraging articles primarily for women for nearly 20 years. It's Not Supposed To Be This Way is a collection of Lysa's reflections and lessons God taught her during a 3-year period of time during which she suffered two major health crises discovered her husband, whom she has five children, had been unfaithful. This is a book expectations, about disappointments and God's goodness to us in the midst of incredible suffering.

Lysa creates an image of her life being shattered, not into pieces that could be mended or glued back together but crushed-until it was nothing but dust. The beautiful reality she learned is that dust in the hands of our maker and creator, Father God can become clay. The clay can be molded and shaped by His skilled hands to become something different, something new - perhaps stronger and more beautiful than it had been before. To see this, we

have to give up control-give up thinking that our way is best, that we know how our pieces should fit. Relinquishing control is terrifying for most of us - we must learn to trust the hands of the potter.

Lysa also talks about the temptations that await us when we are faced with disappointments. We have the temptation to think we deserve control and a better outcome. We can go looking for this "better" outcome in all the wrong places and end up making our difficult situations even worse. Often times, the difficult and even tragic circumstances we will face in life are not of our



own making. What we can control is how we face them - our attitude and perspective can certainly change that outcome. Will we trust God through the unknown? Will we hold on to our belief in His goodness even when our circumstances are not good?



Whether you are currently going through disappointing and a challenging time or not, I would highly recommend this book. It rang true to me in many ways and I believe it will for you too.


