



LAMP & LIGHT JOURNEY

This Summer, we're embarking on a journey of scripture memorization.

I know that might sound a little intimidating, but I assure you, the verses we've chosen have the benefit of being both wonderfully helpful...and...short!

The Apostle Paul, wrote in the second of his letters to his mentee and co-worker, Timothy:

¹⁴ But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it ¹⁵ and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work. (2 Timothy 3:16-17)

What a beautiful description of the divine origin and the authoritative role of scripture for the followers of the Way. All Scripture is profitable for the people of God. It's helpful for correcting our faults and teaching us the way in which we should walk - the way of righteousness.

With the Bible so readily available on mobile and other electronic devices, I've noticed in myself, a distinct lack of discipline in my life when it comes to scripture memorization.

Of course, in my childhood and adolescence, I was eager to memorize scripture, but, that was in a time before the Internet and Apps, a time before we all carried mobile electronic devices capable of searching and identifying any scripture you could want in just a matter of seconds. And there's a difference - really, there is - between having access to the scripture and knowing scripture in your heart. Believe it or not - there will be times in your life when access to the scripture by way of a printed Bible or digital device may not be possible. At a particular time in my life when I faced great adversity, God brought to mind that wonderful and challenging verse from 1 Thessalonians 5:16: "Give thanks in all circumstances." When I needed a bit of correction, Psalm 119:11: "I have stored up your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you." God's scriptures are such a help, in the midst of trials, when we're trapped in the grip of grief, when we need to be held accountable for our un-Christian conduct or even when we need just a few words of encouragement to speak to a friend.

I thank God for his faithfulness in bringing to mind scriptures I had hidden in my heart when I needed help. Turning and returning to his word brought light to my path and helped me move forward in the direction God was leading or to offer a word of encouragement to a friend in need.

This is part of the reason God has given us his scriptures - to equip us for the work we are to do in this life: living righteously, loving our neighbor, and sharing the gospel.

HOW YOU CAN PARTICIPATE IN THE LAMP & LIGHT JOURNEY






The podcast is a great way to keep up with what's happening when you're on the go. Check it out and feel free to share it with a friend.

THE BIRTHDAY OF THE CHURCH PENTECOST IS JUNE 9

In the Book of Acts, we read about the beginnings of Christianity. The Jewish festival called Pentecost was a celebration of God's provision from the harvest. God used that ancient established festival as the beginning point of Christianity. God poured out His Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other first followers of Jesus. There was now a great harvest of souls as 3,000 people were added as believers.

Jesus had promised the Holy Spirit, what He called "The Counselor" or "The Helper" (Greek: "paraclete"). The plan of God was not just for Jesus to die on the cross and rise from the dead, but also to make the way for true believers in God to have the Spirit of God within their lives. Having the Holy Spirit is part of the good news of being a Christ follower. We have a deep, close connection with God. This is not of our own doing, but by God's marvelous gift!

Celebrate Pentecost and remember and honor that God has shared His Holy Spirit with the Church, the body of believers throughout all the centuries and on every continent.

DEEP TRUTH FOR DARK TIMES

PSALM 88

Psalm 88 is, for me, one of the darkest chapters of scripture in the whole Bible. It ends by saying, "Darkness is my only friend." That's pretty dark. Why would such a dark Psalm be in the Bible? Isn't the Bible supposed to give us hope and encourage us?



Yes- the Bible has plenty of good news that should encourage the soul that truly believes. We should be encouraged by the amazing goodness of God and His gracious love toward us, even while we were sinners! We should have great hope that God has a plan for our lives and through Jesus has made a way for us to have a new and meaningful life through Him and with Him in eternity forever. Even with all this good news, there is reason for sobering and dark scriptures in the Bible. God knows we live in a beautiful, but broken world. He knows that our souls will at times be in despair. So, God made sure that the Bible included honest reflections of dark experiences. In the Bible you will find not only the darkness of Psalm 88, but you will find the prophet Elijah depressed, you will find Jesus sweating drops of blood, Job in misery on a pile of ashes, and Paul suffering with his "thorn in the flesh." The Bible is not all sweetness and light. It has real stories, real wisdom, and real truth for the difficult circumstances that come from being a human on planet Earth.

I want to encourage you to explore the richness of the Psalms and other scriptures that admit the darkness of this world. Read Psalm 88 and think on it. Admit any of your dark struggles to God. Confess them out loud if that helps. Pray for others you know who struggle with dark issues and feelings. Pray that your heart would break over the dark issues in the world and those who find themselves in a situation where they feel "darkness is my only friend."

There is hope. We have a God who entered our darkness to be our light. Jesus said, "I am the light of the world." I believe He truly is. The darkness will not overcome Him.

LONG BEGINNINGS: GNU & ME

I was listening recently to a podcast called “The Danger of a Dream,” by Steven Furtick, the pastor of Elevation, a multi-huge church in North Carolina. The sermon was about the Old Testament story of Joseph and the dreams God gave him which led him through many trials (prison and slavery) over many years (two decades) before gaining flesh and blood in a totally unexpected way. Furtick said something that struck me. He said: “God develops dreams in the dark room. The issue is we have an Instagram expectation, but we serve a dark room God.” He used this metaphor to remind us that God’s work, through our dreams, involves His hands-on creative touch, and His perspective always involves the long way. God calls us to follow Jesus, not our dreams. When we follow Jesus, Furtick says, then the dreams follow us.

A group of professors followed God’s call to create a new Christian university called Great Northern University (GNU). We just finished our first official year at GNU (TA DA!) and graduated nine students in May 2019. So, some stats: we have seven full-time professors (all with PhD’s), along with fourteen adjunct instructors, three administrators (President, Provost, and CEO). We have two full-time administrative staff, and a full-time registrar. That’s us! We had 41 full-time students in the fall and 44 in the spring. We also had 10 to 12 people auditing classes. We felt God’s call, dreamed big, and now we are walking it out, sometimes sprinting, up hill and dale, and around the corners as they come. I would say God still is working His stuff in the dark room - the outside red light is on (“Do not enter—pictures are processing”), and those incarnations will be done when they are done. We have seen God do amazing things (come check out our library!). I know I have gotten stronger legs of faith by jumping over hurdles I probably would not have encountered in any other way.



FIRST invitation: I would like to invite you to join GNU on Friday, June 7, 5:30 PM for a really, really, *really* good \$100 hamburger fundraising event. We are in the process of seeking accreditation which I’ve learned can be quite expensive (adding to a long list of things I didn’t know before starting a university), so these funds will be earmarked for that process. We are located at 611 E. Indiana in Spokane (4th Memorial Church is our host). I do have couches and comfy carpets if anyone wants to stay in my small place! Dale makes a mean omelet.

SECOND invitation: I would also like to encourage you to sign up for our monthly newsletter at <https://www.greatnorthernu.org/>. Click at the bottom of the page. Our website recently won three “Spark” awards including “Brightest Spark Award” (competing against much larger schools) and an award for our logo. So check us out! By being part of our newsletter family, you are showing support in a real and tangible (i.e., countable) way. Also, if you know any young (or old) person who is looking for an affordable, Bible-centered, and God-honoring education, point them our way!



As I write, I always feel the impulse to express my appreciation for PFC and tell you how much Dale and I miss serving with you all. I still pray for you daily. And (spoiler alert: *confession coming*), I am not good at maintaining long-distance relationships, as I am sure some of you have noticed. In fact, I am terrible at it. Please know I would love to see you - so if you are in Spokane (which is where I am), feel free to call me up and re-connect. My cell phone number is the same.

Here’s to long beginnings and a faithful God who can see in the dark!

PSALMS OF HELP

I once heard an interview with one of my favorite musicians, Bono, who is a singer and songwriter for the Irish band U2. In the interview, he was talking about writing song lyrics. He was asked if he found it difficult to do. I don’t remember his exact words, but he said something like:



“I only find it difficult NOT to write them. They play over and over in my head. They wake me up at night. The words pursue me relentlessly until I give them their way and write them down. It is as if God Himself has placed them inside my head. I get no rest until I let them out.”

I wondered recently if this was similar to the way King David felt as he penned his Psalms. The Psalms are raw and honest, and deal with depression, despair, regret, shame, guilt, joy, euphoria, celebration and much, much praise. I’m sure King David and the other Psalmists wrote the thoughts and phrases swimming through their heads. I also believe all scripture is God-breathed, and therefore, God directly inspired the Psalmists to write. The Psalms were divinely designed as an outlet, not only for King David, but for me and for you.

I have so enjoyed the series Pastor Corey has recently begun in the book of Psalms. We have only made our way through one chapter so far (Psalm 139), but already we have focused on what I believe to be the key to living in this world, and the key is this: a correct understanding of who God is and who I am in relationship to Him. Who is God? According to Psalm 139, He is the author of all that is. He is the one who designed every living person and thing, who had a beautiful plan long before they were brought into existence. He is the one who never leaves us in our darkness but comes to find us with His light that burns through that darkness. Who does Psalm 139 say I am? I am a creation of God, knit together by Him, fearfully and wonderfully in my mother’s womb. I am wanted, planned and uniquely designed. I fall into darkness. I struggle with hatred. I get lost. I get discouraged. But, I have relationship with the one true God. He’s light in my darkness. He always knows where I am. He authors my courage and my hope.

I am not a song writer or a poet. Words don’t often swirl around in my head demanding I put them to paper. This is precisely why I need the poets and songwriters to express what I am feeling. I need scripture to help my soul pray. God knew I would need this kind of help. He knew I needed the words of the Psalms to encourage my soul, to inspire me to sing praises to His name. This is why he put the words in the head of the Psalmist. If you haven’t yet read through the book of Psalms for yourself, I would encourage you to give it a try. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak into your life through scripture. You may just find the words to express what your soul is singing.
