Spiritual Freedom Pastor Corey Laughary

What does it mean to have freedom as a Christian?

Our old master, sin, is abolished in Christ. "For sin shall no longer be your master, because you are not under the



master, because you are not under the law, but under grace," Romans 6:14.
We don't live by the "law" to please
God. By the gift of God (a.k.a. "grace"), Jesus Christ has set us free from sin and its penalties. We are free to be who God created us to be. We are free to enjoy all the spiritual blessings He has made for us (Ephesians 1:3 - look it up). God is our freedom-giving Master. We worship and serve our God, not out of obligation, but rather out of love for Him. We not out of obligation, but, rather, out of love for Him. We freely choose to love God and love others.

The Bible is not a rule book, and Christian faith is not about "legalism" or following rules to impress God.

The Bible does contain rules and laws that teach us much about what is good and what is not. BUT, learning the rules and following them will not make us righteous and free - only Christ can make us righteous and free. Our new life in Him

will lead us down a new path where the Holy Spirit will be present to guide us into freely following good laws and freely seeking to obey Jesus and His teachings.

Following Christ should not feel like a burden. Following Jesus should feel like freedom! But it is not all about feelings! Our faith in Jesus is established on "facts," not feelings. We have the "fact" or reality of freedom in our soul because we believe in the fact of Jesus Christ's sacrificial death that paid the wages of our sin. In faith, we trust that we

debt. He ransomed us. We owed a toll, He paid it. We stand before Him completely spiritually freed. For the one who trusts/believes in Jesus Christ, His saving work is fact. And because His saving work is fact, our freedom is a fact. Our freedom is real, even on days we don't feel like it is real. On days where we feel bound up with anxiety, or tempted with lust, or struggling with anger - the fact still stands of air Josus Christ has freed us from the power and penalty of sin. Our identity is a settled matter to God. We are no longer slaves to sin. We are freed children, sons and daughters of God! To believe you have freedom in Christ means believing that God has welcomed you into His House, His Family, His Body. You are absolutely free to claim your identity in Christ, no matter your past or reputation. His radical grace has set you your past or reputation. His radical grace has set you absolutely spiritually free! If you are feeling bound, but believe in Christ, there's something amiss. We need to figure that out. Are you trying to put the chains back on? Are you using your freedom to live in the feelings of the flesh? Are you putting on a burden of legalism trying to impress God or maybe some parent figure in your life? Are you wounded and not daily reminding yourself of your beautiful freedom in Christ?

Let me end by saying this clearly: Brothers and Sisters - in and through Jesus Christ you are completely set free to be the best version of yourself that God will lead you to be. How much do you believé in the work God is doing in you?



CHANGES AT THE PARSONAGE

It was May 2, 2004, and Corey and I decided to run Bloomsday together. There was a lot of compromise involved because I was not a runner back then, and Corey had never "walked" Bloomsday. I don't

bit, to add some color and make the area more inviting. I decided to consult the amazing Nicole Flansburg who is a master gardener and landscape designer. HAYTON HERITAGE CEREMONY JULY 14 @ 1 PM

Join the community of Palouse as we gather to remember Lester Hayton and his sacrifice for our country at the park that bears his name.

Lester Hayton grew up in Palouse, Washington and most likely died in the Battle of Chateau-Thierry in France on July, 20th, 1918 during WWI. His death notice reached Palouse on July 18, 1919, after his parents spent almost a year frantically looking for information about their son, and his body was never recovered. Hayton is still listed as missing in action. listed as missing in action.

Community members, wanting to pay their respects to Hayton, named the park after him in 1924 and built a monument. Besides that small memorial, however, his life and sacrifice have been largely forgotten. It is important that we remember him now, how the park got its name, and the loss that a local family experienced.
