### God With Us...A Look at 3 Little Words

Our theme for Advent 2021 is "God With Us."

To say "God with us" sounds nice, but what does it really mean? Maybe you think I'm being a bit silly by asking that question about a short statement with only 3 words and 9 letters. You might be thinking, "Isn't the meaning obvious?" Yes, the basic meaning is obvious, but the depth of that meaning is great. So let's do this, let's ask one question for each of the 3 words and see what the Spirit can teach us about the statement: "God with us."



- Who is God?
- What does "with" mean?
- And who is "us" anyways?

Who is God? God is the eternally existing being, completely good, responsible for creation, a perfect community of love known as Father-Son-and-Holy Spirit. God always has existed and always will exist. God is love. God is all wise. God is the most powerful. God is all-compassionate. God is perfectly just, good, and holy. God didn't have to make us, but wanted to make us. God didn't have to restore us to relationship, but chose to restore us through Jesus. God doesn't have to invite us into the Divine eternal Kingdom, but God wants us there. God is good beyond our wildest imaginations and wants the absolute best for us. God is greater than we know or can imagine.

for "with" is "meta," a preposition that can mean - amid, among, accompanying or in the company of someone. It definitely does not mean: far away, against, absent, opposed, distant, ghosting you, or abandoning. "With," in this sentence, is a preposition that connects God and us, and "with" means connecting, drawing near, being together with us. God is not far from us, but with us. God is not forgetting we exist, but is drawing near to us, wanting to be together with us.

And who is "us" anyways? Some of my favorite Bible words are whoever, everyone, and all. Examples will show why: "...Whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16b), "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved" (Romans 10:13), "But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12). Who is us? WHOEVER believes, EVERYONE who calls on the Lord and ALL who receive Jesus. "Us" is any person anywhere, of any age, any background, with whatever struggles they have. God wants every person to be part of the "us."

The perfect eternally existing loving Being (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) came to be alongside us, in our midst, drawing near, connecting to any, all, whoever, everyone that would depend on Jesus.

Jesus is God with us - and this is very amazing Good News!
