

PFC supports Mission Northwest as a missionary agency in our annual budget. We thought it would be good to share with you who they are and how they help serve God's Kingdom.

Mission Northwest's mission is: "Resourcing and developing churches that connect people to Jesus Christ."

They accomplish this mission through "4 Landmarks"- they are:

Leadership (Training and development of ministry leaders - lay leaders and professionals.)

Church Transformation (Helping churches revitalize, through assessments, vision development, and more.)

Connection (Supporting pastors, helping churches find new pastors, support during interim seasons, support for conflict resolution, accounting, and more.)

Church Planting (Starting new Gospel proclaiming churches throughout the Northwest.)

Rev. Dr. Charles Revis is the Executive Minister of Mission Northwest, and has visited PFC many times. He helped us with an assessment in 2010, and with vision casting that led to our current mission statement and values.

Mission Northwest is headquartered in Post Falls on the Ross Point Camp property, though they are separate entities.

What does it look like to live in small towns and rural places, with all of our imperfect-lives, and yet try to seek to have the perfect peace of God in our midst?

At our Lent Soup Suppers this year, we will be real about life and death matters, as we discuss how to best live a life of "peace" - as individuals and as a "real community" church. For our "[Imperfect] Lives with Perfect Peace" soup suppers, we will be starting with Romans 12:14-18...

Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another. Do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly. Never be wise in your own sight. Repay no one evil for evil, but give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all. If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all.

What does Christ want a "real community" church to offer its neighbors?

A "real community" church comes alongside neighbors in times of mourning and rejoicing (Rom. 12:13).

A "real community" church seeks to live in harmony, whenever possible, with our neighbors (Rom.12:16).

Christians should seek to be humble honorable neighbors, who are seeking to make peace with others.






