After a couple of years in the Covid era, 2022 arrived with a feeling of emerging strength. For Christ's Church here in Palouse, on the Palouse, it was a year of continuing to relearn how to be the Church and serve Christ in new and different ways in an ever-changing world.

We continued our online worship for those who feeling the need to continue to reduce potential exposure to COVID and the variants that keep coming. We have people that find it a valuable resource for various reasons; when the weather is bad, when they are feeling under the weather, when they are receiving chemo, when they are on vacation thousands of miles away, when they want to see their grandchild in a Christmas play, when they live a couple of states away and find us having an online worship service. Our online availability has been used for worship, Bible studies, memorial services, and plays. It allows us to extend our building and ministry via the internet. People a block away to people halfway across the globe have access, and that is a blessing.

In 2022, we continued many of the programs we've had over the years. We had Life Lessons in the Fellowship Hall in May. We again, had Vacation Bible School in the Palouse Park and had wonderful community response. It's been decided that VBS will continue to be held in the park as it was a wonderful place to gather and learn together with lots of open space for activities. All year, Youth Groups were active and grew in attendance. We added a meal before the Wednesday evening gathering. The Nights of Peace on three Thursdays in December, were held again - a meaningful time for both members of the Palouse Community and Palouse Federated Church to find a quiet and peaceful time to reflect on the coming and meaning of the Christ Child. We had a wonderful Christmas program with multi-generations participating in an amazing presentation of the Christmas story. Then on Christmas Eve, we were together again in the sanctuary with two services reflecting on the birth of the savior. Throughout the year, and right up to the Christmas Eve service, we saw PFC being a part of the community and our congregation.

Our Wednesday evening Bible Study has grown in both numbers and function. In 2022, we worked thorough our Spiritual Growth Manual. We added the mealtime with the Youth Group, and we were able to get to know the youth as we gathered for a meal. We each went separate ways for our learning, but the building was being used a place of learning God's word and God's love.

As we enter 2023, we are in the beginnings of an after-school program on Tuesday afternoons. Lots of planning is going into this community outreach that will be held in our building. We have teachers lined up and they are excited to begin this new adventure. Gar-Pal buses will drop the kids off at PFC for this new outreach project. Be praying for the successes this new endeavor will bring to our community youth.

We ended the year with a budget surplus, thanks to God's gracious love and your faithful giving. I am blessed to be able to serve each of you by being on the Church Executive Board. I am blessed to serve with the amazing servants on the Executive Board. I am blessed as we all are blessed with those that volunteer for all the activities here at PFC. I can't name them all and won't even try. We are blessed by music and worship leaders. We are blessed by volunteers of our Care Team that call our congregation and check in with them. We are blessed with people that teach and lead our youth. We are blessed by our Pastor, Communication Director,

and our Youth Leader. We are blessed with those that serve in our ministry at Bishop Place. We are blessed with all those that use the technology that brings PFC into our homes and community every day.

A lot has gone on this past year, and we are looking forward to responding to 2023 and whatever God lays in our path, rejoicing in all things and seeking to serve him! Bible Study Groups

Studying God's Word together is a true blessing. We grow closer to Christ and to one another. In 2022 I thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to serve three Bible Study groups:

- Way Too Early Men's Group Tuesdays at 5:30 AM We met in person and have some who join in on Zoom as needed. We continued to study the upcoming sermon scripture as our main focus.
- Tuesday 10 AM Bible Study for Everyone Meets in person with a zoom option. We continued to study the upcoming sermon scripture as our main focus.
- Wednesday Night Spiritual Growth Group at 6:30 PM We met at the same time as the Youth Group gathers and it was fun to share space and meals with them. After the youth head downstairs we would dive into a Bible study, often starting from PFC's Spiritual Growth Guide. In 2023 we are doing "The Prayer Course" an 8-week course on praying in real life based on the Lord's Prayer.

Guided Prayer

Throughout the journey of my mom's dying I began using guided prayer practices to help me to pray, and frankly to help me to have peace and be able to sleep. God then convicted me to introduce a time of guided prayer following the worship service. We will continue to offer this opportunity to pray together with prayer guides and tools that help us to pray. This has also led me to be open to God's leading that we, as a church family, need to grow much deeper in prayer. Prayer will be a major emphasis in 2023, and I assume it should be an emphasis for however long we are here together.

Bishop Place

We continue to hold a worship service at Bishop Place Senior Living in Pullman, WA. Betty Sawyer has done an amazing job of scheduling songs and piano players for the service. Camille

Wadleigh is a delightful worship leader for the weekly service. I am honored to preach there and so thankful for the faithful community that has developed there. They are very encouraging and each one is a valued part of our church family.

Communication & Creative Arts Report | Tim Sievers

We continue to have an active communication ministry to aid in the administration of the church, to help us with worship, and to connect to our community.

In 2022 we continued the monthly Connections newsletter to bring you thoughtful articles and up-to-date information on events and activities in the church and community. The monthly newsletter is supplemented by our weekly PFC Connect e-mail, which brings relevant and timely information to us each week, as well as links to worship resources, past sermons, and online giving opportunities.

We also sent community-wide e-mails for Lent/Easter and Advent/Christmas. These mailings provide information about our seasonal activities and serve as an invitation and point of connection for the community.

Additionally, we sent two communications, one in late Summer and the other in the Fall updating the congregation on our financial deficit. Those letters brought many responses and helped us maintain our connections to folks near and far. Many recipients sent replies with family updates and donations - more than \$12,000.

One of the things I enjoy most about my work here is what we've come to call the creative arts ministry. I try to imagine ways to help all of you connect better to your faith and our God. Last year we offered Nights of Peace during Lent and Advent. For a couple of hours each week at the Holy Trinity Chapel, people have an opportunity step away from the busyness of life - to light a candle and reflect in a peaceful environment. We're always looking for hosts to prepare the space and help people if they have any questions. Please contact me or the church if you'd like to help or even if you just want to participate.

The Lamp & Light Journey returned in the Summer. Scripture memorization has been an important tool in my faith life and it's become increasingly important for many of you through this annual challenge to memorize important scripture verses that can help you on your journey of faith.

We closed out the year with our Gratitude Campaign - a true season of thanksgiving. I always enjoy reading what you all are thankful for, from cats and turkeys, to community, family, prayer, and our relationship with God.

Children's & Youth Ministry Report | Technology Ministry Report | Hua Ming Newman

VBS

This last year for Vacation Bible School our theme was Rocky Railway. We had Vacation Bible School August 1st to the 5th and during this time the kids and volunteers learned about how Jesus' power pulls us through. During this week we asked the kids and parents to give money so kids in Uganda at the Hope 4 All Children Orphanage could go to school. This year's VBS participants were bold with their donations - raising \$300 the week of VBS. Just a little more than a week later - the total donated to provide schooling for the orphans topped \$2,300! This year we were able to bring back meals for the volunteers each day after VBS and I want to give a great big thanks to the kitchen crew for making that possible. During the week we had around 30 kids and 30 crew leaders. Thank you to everyone who helped.

Youth Group

Youth Group had many changes this year and it grew into something bigger than I thought it would be. Last year Vanessa Moore, who was the pervious youth leader stepped down and I took the role in the beginning of September. From then we started having Wednesday Ministry dinners for the Youth Group in October. During this time, we started to work on partnering with the Garfield churches to turn the Palouse Federated Church Youth Group into a Community Youth Group. With these changes we have started averaging 10 students each week.

Ross Point

Ross Point camps/retreats are awesome ways to encourage kids to learn about faith as well as meet new friends. This last year I directed two camps, the Junior Camp, and Winter Retreat. During the summer we had 26 kids from our area go to camp and we had 3 kids going for the first time. From your donations we gave out 4 Junior High, 3 Senior High and 1 junior scholarship for kids to go and attend camp. Thank you very much! This Winter retreat we had 6 from our area go and for 3 of them it was their first time.

Sunday School

I stepped into the role of leading Sunday school in April of 2022. During that time Sunday School only had 2 to 3 kids each Sunday and sometimes we would have no kids. This was an ongoing problem, and, in the summer, we moved to having a bible story read to the kids each Sunday during service and we went back to Sunday School after school started in Palouse. We still only had 2 to 3 kids each Sunday. During these last couple of months, we have been using this time to brainstorm new ideas and new ways of ministering to kids. In the new year we will be trying an after-school program. This last year we had two other events for the kids and youth. First, we had a Ross Point Cookie sale and our Children's Christmas Program.

Tech Ministry

The tech we have gotten this year and the year before has been changing the way we are able to get services out to people who are not able to come. Last year we built a tech team that consisted of 6 people who rotate each week. A goal we had this year was to make it so one person did not have to do tech each week and allowed so that members can come to church and just worship instead of doing tech. This year we got a switcher for online so we can stream

our services to multiply locations at once. A couple of improvements we have made this year for the online viewers is given them better visuals as well as better audio to hear the service. I want to thank all the tech members for all their hard work this last year.

Worship & Communion

Through this tumultuous year we continued to be led by several singers in Worship at our 10 AM service each week. Thanks to Ben and John, Camille and Connie! We miss the Kellers who have been out for the fall and winter. We pray for a return soon. We are always looking for more song team leaders.

We serve communion each month on the first Sunday of the month and thank the team of servers who take turns setting up and cleaning up. We remember all that "Christ crucified" means to us.

Bishop Place has a rotation of 4 pianists and Camille is a great asset as song leader there each Sunday at 1:30 PM where Pastor Corey continues to lead with a repeat of the morning's sermon, always inspiring. Communion is served on the second Sunday of each month.

Bible Study

"Whenever I attend a church service or Bible Study I find my heart is lighter, burdens seem less heavy, and I hear the good news of how much Jesus loves us." Our ladies Bible study follows the sermon topics and we have deep and uplifting discussions on scripture. About 8 women regularly meet on Wednesday mornings at 10 AM and we hope to have an open door policy where all feel welcome. We are reminded how important it is to receive regular input from scripture so we can get beyond taking in "milk" and getting deeper into the "meat" of what God's best is for us.

Live Chat

You may have seen a teenager or two at the "Live Chat" table in the Fellowship Hall each week. We have been applying object lessons to scripture. We've had 1-4 teens join in with their snack, and we see how God's word can be applied to objects around us. For instance, a few different shoes or boots could relate to running the race, or it could help us think of what the Lord requires of us: "to act justly, to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." Congregational Care Team

20 Steadfast individuals have served on this years Congregational Care Team. Facilities Report | Cam Heusser

2022 was another busy year keeping up with the maintenance of the church and its associated properties.

Except for some minor finish work, the balcony remodeling project was completed. There is now a much larger, safer space for the Audio/Visual crew to conduct their work. The aisles are also larger for when extra seating is needed.

Weeds seemed to grow quicker and more vigorously than usual due to the spring precipitation this year, and a lot of effort was put into keeping the flower beds and gravel parking lots cleaned up. If anybody is interested in this type of work, help is always appreciated!

An ongoing drainage issue worsened in the church basement this spring, and old drain lines needed to be plugged and rerouted to prevent rain water and runoff from seeping through the basement door. This was not the only flooding to occur this year in the basement, as we also experienced a leaky hot water heater and a sewer backup leading up to Christmas. Thankfully we were able to find that the problem was due to a cleanout port cap that had worked its way down the sewer line and become lodged so that it was causing problems in both the 620 N. Mary St. property and the church building. Once the cap was removed, drainage improved dramatically in both buildings.

Planning is also underway for some bigger projects that may take place in the upcoming year. A new roof will be needed soon on the 620 N. Mary St. property, and the main parking lot will also need to be resurfaced. We will also need to replace the aging sewer line leaving the church building before more drainage issues appear. Please let Pastor Corey or one of the Board members know if you are interested in helping out with any of the facilities work.

Missions & Mission Giving | Peggy Collier

Palouse Federated Church is a tithing church, which means that ten percent of the funds given to the church are given to support missions. For 2022, the mission giving tithe included the following causes: Mission Northwest, Care Net of the Palouse, Hope for All Children Orphanage in Uganda, missionary Walt White, MAF Adams Family, Konnor Massa, Adult and Teen Challenge, Kairos Outside of Eastern Washington, Ross Point Camp, and Family Promise of the Palouse. These items are detailed in the church budget.

In addition to the budgeted giving, we also support mission giving through offerings and special giving campaigns. We collect offerings for One Great Hour of Sharing and World Mission Offering, which are organized and distributed through the American Baptist Church under International Ministries. The money from these offerings is used by missionaries all over the world for humanitarian aid, help with refugees, and education.

Locally, funds are collected to buy food boxes and food vouchers for area families in need at Christmas. We provided Christmas gifts for ten residents at Lakeland Village this year. These ten residents have no families to provide gifts for them. It was a joy to deliver the gifts that everyone donated to Lakeland Village. Your donations were thoughtful and generous. Extra funds were collected so that the children at Hope for all Children Orphanage in Uganda could have a special Christmas meal, celebrate, and receive new clothes.
